## LONDON START FOR RALLYE MONTE CARLO HISTORIQUE 2023

We have replaced the June edition of Classic Updates with a Monte News Flash so that we can bring you the latest news from the Automobile Club de Monaco. A couple of weeks ago I had a meeting with the Historique Commission team at ACM over lunch at the Club. It was a very good meeting and an excellent lunch. This was the first meeting with the team for over two years due to the pandemic.

For 2023 the London start will be at Brooklands, the home of British Motorsport, on the evening of Wednesday 25 January. Planning for the event is now underway and it promises to be something very special.

At my meeting with ACM we also discussed, in some detail, the future of the Rallye Monte Carlo Classique. You may remember that the first Classique left from John O’Groats and it was basically a touring event. Over the years it has evolved and last year some of the stages in the Historique were introduced into the Classique, but without the timing. It was felt that now was the time for the Classique to become a full part of the Rallye Monte Carlo Historique. The Classique has now come of age. It will be incorporated into an appropriate age related class in the Regulations for the Historique. It will have its own award. ACM are keen to encourage pre-war cars, as well as early 1950’s cars. It was a big decision but I think the right one.

The format of the Rallye Monte Carlo Classique – a challenging winter touring event run in parallel with the Historique - is expected to continue but will be reserved for important historical occasions in Monte history. For example, we discussed the possibility of running an event to mark the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the first John O’Groats start. It will be something special to look forward to for those of you who enjoy challenging touring events.

## WILLY CAVE TO BE HONOURED



As most of you will know, Willy Cave died early this year, just after the 2022 Monte, which he had fully intended to enter until his doctor intervened.

Willy competed in the Rallye from the early 1950's onwards. His home town was London and he started from London in 1969, which was the last London Start. So the 2023 London Start will be in his memory and there will be an award for the best placed navigator starting from London in 2023, the Willy Cave Cup.


On that occasion he was in a BMC Works 1800 and the other crew members were Peter Jopp and the very famous Tommy Wisdom.

After overcoming many problems they reached the final control with 30 secs to spare and finished a creditable 25<sup>th</sup> overall. They were the winners of the Royal Automobile Club Challenge Trophy and the Autosport Trophy for the best all British entry.


